ANAB is a **non-governmental organization** that provides accreditation to some registrars, while our organization, G-PMC, is accredited by The American Board of Accredited Certifications (www.aboac.org). We are, therefore, an accredited certification body.

Hi Joe,

In looking at your web site, I noticed your various ISO certifications and the registrar that you are using.

Are you aware that this registrar is not an accredited certification body?

In other words, G-PMC is not approved by ANAB to certify companies to the standard.

The impact of this is that the certification may not be recognized by other companies who know what to look for, particularly world-wide.

That doesn't necessarily mean that you have a bad QMS, just that it wasn't checked by an accredited source. Kind of like getting your law degree from Columbia (the country, not the college!) I would be concerned about this if you are going after Sikorsky as a client; they may question this...

So, what is Mr. Colapietro talking about? Acting as an agent of CONNSTEP, he is advising our clients and potential clients that we are not accredited. This false statement is completely destructive to our business.

As a first step toward relief, we do not want to take legal action against CONNSTEP for this participation of your agent, Mr. Colapietro in wrongful actions directed against our legitimate business operation. Therefore, as the CEO of G-PMC, I am first informing you of this situation, providing you with the wrongful actions of your representative, and requesting that you order Mr. Colapietro to cease and desist from maligning our corporate name and harming our client/potential customer relations. In addition, and because of the damage he has already caused, we request an apology letter from your management to "The Plastic factory "and forwarded to my attention – our client who was victimized by Mr. Colapietro acting against our corporation, G-PMC. Furthermore, upon receipt of your agreement to comply with our request, you shall arrange a meeting between representatives of CONNSTEP, and G-PMC to close out this matter and preclude any future actions on the part of all parties relative to these kinds of CONNSTEP incidents.

In addition, CONNSTEP's agent's actions maybe a serious violation of Federal Anti-trust laws. It is concerning as CONNSTEP is an organization that receives federal funding as well.

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
Dear Daryl,
